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



Tauck has invested in more than 80 national parks, monuments and other places we visit to better protect our planet and preserve these special historical and cultural destinations for generations to come. Examples include: Mesa Verde, Grand Teton National Park Foundation, National Civil Rights Museum, Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center, Jasper National Park, and Notre Dame Cathedral.

Preservation & Volunteerism

Going hand-in-hand with destination grants is our commitment to encourage and actively participate in volunteerism. These efforts include Tauck's on-tour national park guest volunteer program that won a "Preserve America" presidential award, and Hammer Corps, our program in which Tauck employees helped restore and preserve iconic treasures such as Mormon Row in Grand Teton National Park. Additionally, hundreds of Tauck employees have participated in annual volunteer days in places like Valley Forge and Ellis Island.

Our itineraries are woven into the very fabric of places where we travel. We partner with many family-owned businesses and businesses of all kinds, from very small to large. We create jobs and improve the economic health and vitality of destinations. Travelling with a light "footprint" enabled by smaller groups and lower guest-to-guide ratios, we are mindful about how we travel to ensure we make a positive impact.





Here are some of the ways travelling with Tauck makes an impact through tours featured in this brochure:

Scylla, our riverboat partner

Scylla's mission is two-fold – to take care of guests and crew (through multiple programs to support their staff both on land and water) and to protect the environment. Regular hull cleaning ensures low water resistance while sailing and a cleaner–burning diesel fuel for direct emission reduction. Reusable water bottles help the environment; new water filters and systems ensure that untreated wastewater doesn't enter the rivers, and Scylla has utilized LED technology in addition to installing solar panels.

Restoration of Dvořák Birth House

A Tauck grant supports the restoration of the Baroque birth house of celebrated Czech composer Antonín Dvořák, adjacent to Nelahozeves Castle in the Czech Republic. This national landmark is a significant destination for music lovers and will be developed into a center for education, inspiring and nurturing young musical talent with dedicated practice and performance spaces, courses, and workshops – and diverse outreach programs that will offer new ways to appreciate and engage with Dvořák's life and music.

The Ehreshoven Foundation

For nearly a decade, Tauck has been a supporter of The Ehreshoven Foundation through our exclusive visits to Schloss Ehreshoven on select Rhine cruises. The Ehreshoven Foundation was founded in 1923 as a monastery within the castle to support elderly and impoverished women. The mission of the foundation includes environmental efforts in the preservation of local woodlands, and sustainable forestry initiatives.



DAY 1

Arrive Budapest and embark

Tour begins: 5:00 PM. A transfer is included from Budapest's Ferenc Liszt Airport or Keleti train station to your riverboat. Join us for a welcome toast this evening prior to your first dinner aboard ship. **Meals D**

DAY 2

Budapest's landmark sites

Budapest is split into "Buda" and "Pest" by the Danube River. This morning, you have a choice in sightseeing – explore the Buda side of the city on a guided tour that includes the opulent State Opera House, Fisherman's Bastion and late- Gothic style Matthias Church (may be closed on some days due to services). Alternatively, a more active visit includes the State Opera House and the historic Castle District. Your afternoon is free to explore as you please prior to a Tauck Exclusive cocktail reception and dinner at the Akadémia Club in the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Meals BLD

■ DAY 3

A choice of sightseeing in Budapest

Begin the day with a choice of sightseeing that includes a guided visit to the Hungarian Parliament that introduces the city's turbulent 20th-century history. Alternatively, learn about the city's historic thermal water springs on a visit to the famed Szechenyi Bath Spa. Reboard your riverboat this afternoon, and begin your cruise along the Danube River, bound for Bratislava, Slovakia. **Meals BLD**

■ DAY 4

Explore Bratislava, Slovakia

Our local expert shares insider anecdotes about Bratislava, before you head off to explore the city by foot or bicycle*. On a walking tour of the city's historic center, see 17 centuries of history chronicled in sites including the Old Town Hall, Baroque Habsburg-era palaces, the Opera House, Slovak Philharmonic Hall and St. Martin's Cathedral. Or bicycle* to the "Iron Curtain" area with a local guide who shares personal insights about life here, past and present. Tonight, a troupe of traditional Slovak dancers perform onboard the riverboat. Meals BLD

■ DAY 5

A day well spent in Vienna

Your riverboat arrives this morning in Vienna, Austria, where our local guides join you for a choice of city sightseeing walking tours following a drive along the Ringstrasse. An afternoon and evening at leisure let you explore the city as you please, including outstanding museums, the historic Vienna Prater amusement park, and more. **Meals BLD**

■ DAY 6

A choice in Vienna & an Imperial Evening

Vienna's palatial treasures star today on your choice of sightseeing tours. Take a guided look inside the 1,441-room Schönbrunn Palace, the Habsburgs' summer residence; its history spans more than 300 years and reflects the different tastes, interests, and aspirations of successive Habsburg monarchs. Or, you can visit the Kunsthistorisches Museum, built in 1891 to house the art collections of the imperial family. Tonight, we invite you to attend a Tauck exclusive experience - our private Imperial Evening at opulent Palais Pallavicini, a private Baroque palace in Vienna that film buffs may have spotted in the 1940s film noir classic *The Third Man* – or more recently, in the streaming series The Regime. Welcome cocktails and dinner precede an unforgettable evening of musical performance celebrating the legacy of the composers who made Vienna Europe's center of music during the Habsburg era. Later this evening, cruise to medieval Dürnstein. Meals BLD

■ DAY 7

Dürnstein & Wachau Valley cruise

Wake up in Dürnstein, where sightseeing choices include a walking tour along cobblestone streets for a closer look at the town's 16th-century Baroque houses and 13th-century Romanesque church, as well as a visit to Dürnstein Abbey and a wine tasting. Or, if you prefer, join us for a bicycling* adventure in the Wachau Valley, Austria's lush wine-producing region. This afternoon, cruise the Wachau Valley (a UNESCO World Heritage Site), with commentary from your Tauck Director as you view lush vineyards, fairy tale castles and ancient monasteries.

■ DAY 8

Salzburg sights or Cesky Krumlov

Sightseeing choices include a walking tour of Salzburg that features Old Town, Mirabell Gardens, and Mozart's birthplace. Alternatively, travel to Cesky Krumlov, which has been called a living gallery of elegant Renaissance-era buildings, for a walking tour that includes Cesky Krumlov Castle. A third option is to stay in Linz and explore as you please. Tonight, enjoy entertainment provided by local musicians. **Meals BLD**

■ DAY 9

Engelhartszell and opportunity for bicycling

This morning in Engelhartszell, you have an opportunity to visit a home where your host shares conversation and perhaps a taste of Austrian goodies. After your visit, a walking tour introduces you to 18th-century Engelhartszell Abbey along with a visit to the lovely Schütz Art Museum. Reboard your riverboat early afternoon, and cruise to Germany. If you wish, join us for a rigorous afternoon bicycle ride* along the Danube to Passau (fairly strenuous, the ride is for experienced cyclists only). Meals BLD

Lobkowicz Palace

There is nothing that quite says Old World Europe like a night at the palace – and you'll do just that in Prague with a wine reception and dinner at Lobkowicz Palace, a Baroque legend in the heart of the city that is still family owned today. On a private tour, view a collection of art and original musical manuscripts reflecting six centuries of Central Europe's cultural, social, political and economic life.

DAY 10

Disembark / Regensburg & Prague

Disembark your ship for a choice of excursions. Join your local guide for a walking tour of Regensburg – boasting more than 1,400 historical structures, best explored on foot, then travel to Prague. Alternatively, journey to Prague for an exclusive visit to Strahov Monastery that takes you to places inaccessible to the general public, plus a short walk through Hradcany Castle. The remainder of the day is free. **Meals BL**

DAY 11

The legacy of many centuries in Prague

A choice of excursions this morning features a walking tour of the Josefov Quarter and Jewish heritage sites, or a stroll through centuries of Prague's history. Afternoon sightseeing takes you inside Prague's historic architectural sites, including the magnificent Gothic Cathedral of St. Vitus, the Old Palace and the Hradcany (Castle) district, or on a drive through the Little Quarter of Mala Strana, the oldest neighborhood in the city. This evening, join us for a reception, tour and dinner at 16th-century Lobkowicz Palace at Prague Castle, exclusive to Tauck guests; a family insider hosts the evening, which will be long remembered. **Meals BD**

DAY 12

Journey Home

Alternatively, pay a poignant guided visit to the museum and memorial on the site of the infamous World War II-era Mauthausen-Gusen concentration camp, approximately 20 kilometers east of Grein. You'll tour the camp's main complex, preserved as a museum and memorial to the victims of the last major concentration camp liberated by the Allies. Back aboard the riverboat, enjoy dinner and local entertainment tonight. Meals BLD



Historically know as Pressburg, Bratislava is the capital city of Slovakia, set along the Danube River and borders Austria and Hungary. Choose to explore this pedestrian-only, 18th-century town or head for the countryside towards the Little Carpathian mountains for wine tasting in a vineyard.







■ DAY 6

Belgrade & a private palace evening

Bucharest & a night at a palace




