ARE THERE A LOT OF WALKS ON THE TOUR?

There are walks on our tours, however, they are mostly short in distance and many stops are available. Your Cruise Director, Tour Director or Driver-Guide will be able to advise you of different options you can take. Kimberley and Outback 4WD tours have longer walks in warm climates, with often unsteady ground. Walks information can be found on our website.

CAN I TRAVEL ALONE?

Of course! Many of our passengers are solo travellers, though there are a limited number of solo rooms available on each trip.

WHAT LEVEL OF MOBILITY IS REQUIRED?

A good level of health and fitness is required to participate on a Travelmarvel holiday. You will be required to embark and disembark the paddle steamer and Zodiacs on cruises or coaches unaided, climb stairs and walk on uneven terrain. We recommend being able to walk unaided for a minimum of a kilometre, unless you are on a remote Kimberley journey, where some walks can reach up to five kilometres in hot conditions on uneven ground. If you have any mobility issues you will be required to complete a Travelmarvel Health and Fitness Mobility Form. Please speak to your booking agent regarding this.

IS THERE A TOILET ON THE COACH/4WD VEHICLE?

Yes, there is a toilet on board all of our coaches and 4WD vehicles for guest use. We also make regular rest breaks as well.

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO TRAVEL TO AUSTRALIA?

We operate tours in Australia all year round. With a varying climate, the best time to travel in Australia is based on what kind of experience you're after. Peak travel times fall between March and November for Western Australia, the Northern Territory and Queensland, and September and March in Tasmania and Victoria when the weather is warmer. You may prefer the quieter shoulder season between April and May when the weather is cooler and the attractions are less crowded.

WHAT CLOTHING SHOULD I BRING?

Naturally this depends on personal preferences, however it is recommended that passengers take into account the time of year they are travelling in and bring a variety of warm and cool clothing. When touring in remote inland areas, nights can get cold, so prepare accordingly. Pack sufficient lightweight, comfortable clothing and footwear — wearing layers is the best option. You should also ensure your shoes fit well and have been broken in prior to your trip, to ensure they are comfortable for all types of excursions. Wet shoes (reef shoes or rubber sandals) are essential for Kimberley coast cruises. Most guests dress casually on tour, however, if heading into town for a night or a Welcome or Farewell Dinner on your cruise, you may want to wear something smarter.

WILL I NEED A PASSPORT OR VISA?

Expedition Cruise guests must have a valid passport with at least six months' validity from the return date. It is your responsibility to ensure these are obtained prior to departure. No visas are required for Australian and New Zealand passport holders.



I GET MOTION SICKNESS AND HAVE A DOCTOR'S CERTIFICATE ADVISING THIS, CAN I SIT IN THE FRONT ROW OF THE COACH/4WD VEHICLE?

To ensure all passengers have the opportunity to enjoy sitting at the front of the coach or 4WD vehicle, we have implemented a daily seat rotation system. This system is not able to be adjusted to suit individual needs. Therefore, you may wish to bring along some natural remedies and medication to assist with motion sickness.

I HAVE SPECIAL DIETARY REQUIREMENTS, CAN THESE BE CATERED FOR?

All dietary requests will be taken into consideration and fulfilled where possible. The wide selection of menus and choice of dishes available will help in meeting special dietary requests. Please advise your booking agent as soon as possible of any dietary requests.

IS THERE INTERNET OR WI-FI AVAILABLE ON TOUR?

In some remote areas, mobile phone service is extremely limited. Wi-Fi internet is available at most hotels, lodges and on board the PS Emmylou paddle steamer but is not guaranteed. Wi-Fi internet is available on board the expedition ship at a charge, however it is limited and not guaranteed. Mobile coverage is not available during the cruise due to the remote locations.

WILL I NEED TRAVEL INSURANCE?

Travel insurance is mandatory on all cruises and highly recommended on all land tours. Travel insurance must be arranged prior to departure to ensure that you are covered for any unforeseen circumstances that may arise on tour (including cancellations, fees, medical and

curtailment expenses, loss of luggage etc). In most cases, cruise travel insurance will cover medical expenses. This includes treatment from the onboard doctor, who operates under international standards.

WHAT ADAPTORS WILL I NEED?

In the Kimberley, our wilderness lodges generate their own power. Each lodge can assist in charging items in central dining areas. CPAP machines can be accommodated when advised at time of booking.

On board your expedition cruise, the voltage is 200V AC (European standard) and 110V AC (North American standard). A limited number of adaptors are available on board and you are welcome to bring your own. For safety reasons, hair irons and clothes irons cannot be used in staterooms. Hairdryers are provided in each stateroom.

HOW MUCH LUGGAGE CAN I BRING?

On our Expedition and River Cruises, we have a limit of one piece of luggage with a weight of no more than 20kgs per person with sizing regulations. On 4WD Remote Journeys, there is a limit of one soft bag weighing no more than 16kg and with dimensions of no more than 66cm length x 35cm width x 32cm height. OHS regulations apply to the lifting of overweight items. This is regardless of any airfare luggage limits available in your flight booking class.

WHAT ARE ZODIACS?

Used in our Expedition Cruises, Zodiacs are versatile, inflatable boats, which provide a platform for observing wildlife from sea level. They provide a fast and safe way to go ashore in remote locations and are invaluable for exploration.

Force majeure event means the occurrence of an event that is beyond Travelmarvel's reasonable control and which could not have been reasonably prevented by Travelmarvel, which includes, but is not limited to: (a) war, armed conflict, criminal damage, riot, civil strife, industrial dispute, terrorist activity or the threat of any such acts; (b) natural disaster (including but not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide), adverse weather conditions, high or low water levels; (c) nuclear or other industrial accident causing environmental pollution or contamination; or (d) change in law, meaning, enactment, amendment (including repeal) in the law or administration of any law in Australia or any jurisdiction or territory relevant to the booking contract, which includes changes in statute, regulation, determination, by-law, declaration, license and the common law as applicable from time to time, including changes or amendments in regulations or access to services, sites or countries caused by declared epidemic or pandemic events

TERMINATION OF BOOKING CONTRACT OR CHANGE

OF TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS DUE TO FORCE MAJEURE
If Travelmarvel, in its reasonable opinion, considers that any force
majeure event prevents Travelmarvel (whether directly or through its employees, contractors, subcontractors and agents) from lawfully or safely providing any products or services subject of the booking contract with you, Travelmarvel may immediately by written notice: (a) terminate the booking contract (in whole or in part); or (b) change your travel arrangements as reasonably practicable to ensure your safety and invoice you for any additional costs.

As you are required to purchase travel insurance to adequately protect yourself against these risks, your policy needs to respond to these risks. Although we take care in selecting the independent service providers and the optional excursions conducted by some independent service providers, Travelmarvel is not responsible for the conduct of the independent service providers, their servants and agents or for any ramifications of that conduct. Optional excursions may, depending on your holiday package, include activities such as climbing, exploring, bike riding, swimming and snorkelling. You accept and assume the risk involved with these activities.

LOCAL PURCHASES

Travelmarvel is not responsible for any items you may purchase locally i.e. jewelleny/furniture etc. You acknowledge that you are solely responsible for any import duty or freight costs.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS & LOST ITEMS

For security reasons, valuables should be kept to a minimum and packed in your hand luggage along with your medicines. It is your responsibility to look after your property at all times and you must ensure you are adequately covered by comprehensive travel insurance in the event of any loss.

Final payment of the balance of your holiday package price is due 100 days prior to departure unless stated in the terms of a special offer. Travelmarvel reserves the right to cancel any ticket or booking or to refuse to carry any passenger where payment has not been received within the specified time. All fares and charges are in AUD. Payment in full is required at time of booking for reservations made less than 100 days before departure from Australia. If Travelmarve is unable to confirm your reservation, all monies will be refunded. Hotels may apply surcharges for late booking requests.

The services of a Travelmarvel Tour Director are included in all land tours (subject to minimum numbers). If minimum numbers are not met, the Tour Director's duties may be covered by a Driver Guide. Rail journeys, unless specified are independent journeys.

be made in writing by the person who made the original booking, or their travel agent. If it is possible to make the change, it will be subject to an administration charge of \$70 per person and payment of any further costs incurred as a result of the change.

CANCELLATION POLICY

For all holiday packages in this publication, the following Travelmarvel cancellation fees apply:

Small Ship Expedition cruises have an onboard doctor and infirmary. Passengers are responsible for all charges that result from visiting either the onboard medical practitioner or a local medical facility. Travelmarvel is not responsible for the type or quality of medical services you may receive.

LUGGAGE LIMITS

Land touring is conducted in 4WD vehicles with limited luggage capacity. Each passenger is requested to limit their luggage to one small/medium soft bag or suitcase weighing no more than 16kg (35 lb approx.) and with dimensions of no more than 66cm length x 35cm width x 32cm height. Cameras, make-up bags etc. should be carried separately. Should you have excess luggage, it is your responsibility to organise for this to be forwarded to your final destination.


